COMMUNITY BOARDS

The New York City Revision Commission proposes sweeping changes to community boards by recommending a ballot question to establish Community Board Members' term limits of four consecutive two-year terms with staggered implementation. Each Community Board Member represents the interests and needs of his or her neighborhood, and is appointed for two years by the borough president; half nominated by the city council members who represent the area. Some members are not reappointed, as it is not a lifetime position. They assist in matters which affect part or all

of the community: traffic, transportation, education, environment, housing and buildings are also a concern of a board, as well as zoning matters. These members are the voice of the people. They volunteer their time and energy to invest in their communities and receive no compensation in return.

I believe it is very important to keep people with "institutional knowledge," especially for particularly complex board functions. The core of each board is the long-serving seasoned members, who are the target of this legislation. If you dismiss these members you weaken the board. To weaken the board is to weaken the voice of the people. If the amendment passes, "Many members of the community boards who have knowledge about land use and other issues

would automatically be off the board. With a four-term limit, I believe by the time new members develop this knowledge, they'll be "term-limited off the board."

Many community boards have vacancies, so why limit board members when there are still openings? We also encourage community members to join, as it is important to hear from all sectors of our diverse community. Applications are filed in January (available online at queensbp.org) and appointments are announced in March. I believe that imposing term limits would not be good for the communities they serve.


